Golden Duke™ Eastern Hemlock

Tsuga canadensis 'MonJers' PPAF

Introduced by Monrovia. Discovered by a Monrovia craftsman in Dayton, Oregon. Zones 4-7.

This superb new conifer, native to North America, nearly glows with bright golden-yellow foliage followed by striking velloworange winter foliage on graceful, upright pyramidal arching branches. Attracts birds, too. Compact, upright and slow growing, this shrub reaches 6-10 feet tall and 2-3 feet wide in 10 years. Ideal as a focal point for the landscape or rock garden, but also a stately choice in a large container. Prefers partial sun to full shade and aver-



age to enriched, evenly moist soil. Higher sun tolerance in cool, northern climates. Evergreen.

Ketchup 'n' Fries™ TomTato®

Solanum lycopersicum/Solanum tuberosum 'Ketchup 'n' Fries'

Introduced by SuperNaturals Grafted Vegetables LLC/ Log House Plants/Plug Connection. Originated from the Dutch grower, Beekenkamp. Zone 10.

An incredible innovation in vegetable growing - a sweet cherry tomato plant grafted onto a delicious white potato plant. Harvest tomatoes throughout the summer and early fall, then cut the tomato plant at the base and remove. Leave the potatoes in ground for 10-14 days to season and sweeten, then harvest. Reaches 5-6 feet tall and 4 feet wide. Best grown in the ground or in a #15 or larger container. Grow in full sun. Ketchup 'n' Fries is a strong, vigorous hybrid with disease resistance.

Perpetua Blueberry

Vaccinium corymbosum 'Perpetua' USPP #24209

Offered by Fall Creek Farm & Nursery Inc. as part of the BrazelBerries® collection. Perpetua was developed by Chad Finn at the USDA-ARS in collaboration with Oregon State University. Zones 4-8.

Perpetua is a true double-cropping blueberry that sets one crop of fruit in mid-summer and then flowers a second time to provide ripe fruit in the fall. The leaves are dark green, somewhat shiny, and curly or twisted in the spring and summer, turning to deep reds and greens in the winter. The new canes are bright yellow and red in winter. Berries are



smallish in size and are mild and sweet. Upright, vaseshaped bush habit reaches 4-5 feet tall and wide. Prefers full sun and well-drained, acidic soil.

Pinot Meunier Purple Pixie Grape

Vitis vinifera 'Pinot Meunier Purple'

Introduced by SuperNaturals Grafted Vegetables LLC/Log House Plants/Plug Connection. Natural mutation discovered by a grape researcher/breeder at Cornell University. Zone 3.

The Pixie Grape is the world's first true dwarf grapevine, Grows amazing miniature clusters of grapes. Easy-to-care-for plant that continually fruits and can be grown indoors or out and used as an edible decorative potted plant or in the garden. Varietal is typically used to produce Champagne or wine and can be enjoyed fresh or used as a garnish. Sweet, tart flavor. Reaches no more than 2 feet tall and 1 foot wide at maturity. Best used in containers, though also grows well in the landscape. Prefers full

sun and moderate moisture.

EverColor® Eversheen Carex

Carex EverColor 'Eversheen'

Introduced by Concept Plants. Developed by Pat Fitzgerald from Ireland. Zones 5-10.

A new evergreen Carex to the market, Eversheen has striking chartreuse foliage with a green edge. A compact selection, mounded in habit, this variety offers homogeneous growth and a strong rooting system. Reaches 16 inches tall and wide. Ideal in the landscape as a mass planting, in the perennial border, as a specimen choice or in mixed containers.

Grenade Ice Plant

This cultivar shines with fiery red pinwheel blooms over tight blue-green foliage. If placed in full sun, this variety will bloom early in the start of summer and continue on into late fall, making it a true repeat bloomer. A compact habit — 3 inches tall to 12 inches wide — this variety is an excellent ground cover choice. Prefers full sun and good drainage. Drought resistant.

Amethyst Ice Plant

Delosperma 'Jewel of Desert Amethyst'

Introduced by Concept Plants. Developed by Koichiro Nishikawa from Japan. Zones 6b-9.

This cultivar delights with bright pink pinwheel blooms

with a purple center over tight blue-green foliage. If placed in full sun, this variety will bloom early in the start of summer and continue on into late fall, making it a true repeat bloomer. A compact habit — 3 inches tall to 12 inches wide — this variety is an excellent ground cover choice. Prefers full sun and good drainage. Drought resistant.


Opal Ice Plant

Delosperma 'Jewel of Desert Opal'

Introduced by FlorSAIKA. Zones 7-11.

This cultivar cheers any garden area right up with bright fuchsia pinwheel blooms over tight bluegreen foliage. If placed in full sun, this variety will bloom early in the start of summer and continue on into late fall. making it a true repeat bloomer. A compact habit - 3 inches tall to 12 inches wide this variety is an excellent ground cover choice. Prefers full sun and good drainage. Drought resistant.

Digiplexis® Illumination® Apricot

Digiplexis Illumination 'Apricot' PPAF

Introduced by Plant Development Services Inc. to the Sunset Western Garden Collection® and the Southern Living® Plant Collection through Cultivaris. Zones 8b-11.

Striking spires of bicolor apricotorange blossoms illuminate this reblooming perennial. Enhanced with speckled yellow throats and a dark lip, blossoms draw hummingbirds and butterflies into the garden. Fast growing to 36 inches tall and spreading in habit. Ideal for beds, borders and can be used as a cut flower. Plant in full sun to part shade in welldrained garden soil. Water-wise once established.

Moonlight Chinese Fairy Bells

Disporum cantoniense 'Moonlight' USPP #24556

Offered by Monrovia. Discovered by Reinier van Elderen in Lijnden, The Netherlands. Zones 7-10.

The star of this plant is the unique and distinctive variegated foliage that radiates silvery white and green from each leaf blade, becoming suffused with pink-purple hues as temperatures cool in the fall. Graceful. arching stems emerge in spring, followed by clusters of small, showy, yellow flowers in late spring to summer. A moderate grower with a clumping habit, this shrub maxes out at $1\frac{1}{2}$ -2 feet tall and wide, so it's especially useful in mass plantings, under trees and as a container accent.



Prefers dappled to full shade and humus-rich, consistently moist, well-drained soils. Slowly spreads to form colonies. Semi-evergreen.

Sombrero® Baja Burgundy Echinacea

Echinacea × hybrida 'Baja Burgundy'

Introduced in North America by Darwin Perennials. Zones 4-9.

A truly unique color in the commercial Echinacea world, Sombrero® Baia Burgundy boasts floriferous, rich burgundy flowers atop well-branched plants. Blooms June through August, is resistant to leaf spot and mildew, and is quite hardy. Compact grower to 18-20 inches tall and wide. Ideal for use in the landscape or as a feature plant. Plant in full sun and welldrained soil.

Butterfly™ Rainbow Marcella Coneflower

Echinacea 'Rainbow Marcella' PPAF

Offered by Skagit Gardens Inc. Bred by AB-Cultivars, introduced by Plants Nouveau LLC. Zones 5-9.

A rainbow combination of pink and orange blooms, they open bright tangerine-orange, changing to deep mauve and lasting throughout the summer without fading. The unique color change begins at the center of the flower and moves towards the tips of the petals. Very floriferous with sturdy stems that will not flop due to overhead watering or rain. Mounded, bushy habit reaches 18-24 inches tall and wide. Ideal for use in the mixed border or in a mixed patio container. Prefers full sun and moist, but well-drained garden soil.

Sweet Sixteen Coneflower

Echinacea 'Sweet Sixteen' PPAF

Offered by Skagit Gardens Inc. Bred by AB-Cultivars, introduced by Plants Nouveau LLC. Zones 5-9.

Deep raspberrymagenta, near burgundy doubleflowered blooms sit atop thick, sturdy stems like a top hat on a cane. Strong stems do not flop after a storm. Dozens of flowers come into bloom at once and are followed by a parade of perfectly rich raspberry, double pompom flowers for months. Dwarf habit reaches 12 inches tall in full bloom and 16 inches wide. Ideal for use in the front of a perennial bor-



der or in mixed containers. Prefers full sun, average garden soil; moist, but well drained.

Madame Lemonnier Hellebore

Helleborus × lemonnierii 'Madame Lemonnier'

Introduced by Heuger. Found in a private garden in France. Natural crossing of *H. niger* × *H. orientalis* hybrid. Zone 5.

Large, upward-facing pink flowers bloom from midwinter to early spring. A great addition for adding winter blooms to shady gardens. Excellent clumping habit reaches a height and width of 18 inches. Prefers part shade and moist, well-drained soil.

Meerlo Lavender

Lavandula allardii 'Meerlo' PPAF

Introduced by Plant Development Services Inc. to the Sunset Western Garden Collection® and the Southern Living® Plant Collection. Originated from Kiwiflora in New Zealand. Zones 9-10.

The brightly variegated foliage with a highly fragrant aroma makes Meerlo stand out among others. One of the most heat, humidity and drought-tolerant lavenders on the market, this vigorous variety will hold its color and fragrance, and is less picky about soil conditions than other lavenders. A moderate-to-fast grower, it reaches 2-3 feet tall and wide. Excellent choice for borders, garden beds and containers. Prefers full sun to part shade and average, well-drained soils. Water-wise once established.

Bandera Purple Lavender

Lavandula stoechas 'Bandera Purple'

Offered by Kieft Seed. Bred in Holland by PanAmerican Seed, successfully trialed across North America. Zones 7-10.

The first professionalquality *L. stoechas* from seed, comparable to vegetative-quality standard. Very floriferous, producing many medium-sized rich purple spikes with good flags. A self-cleaning variety with a longer flowering period. Bandera Purple maintains a mounded habit and will not fall open. Offers a delightfully light fragrance. Low growing, reaching 7-9 inches tall and 10-12 inches wide at maturity. Ideal for use in the garden, as a border



or in mixed containers. Makes an excellent gift plant for retail. Prefers full sun and well-drained, relatively dry soil. Low maintenance.

Lucky Lots Abelia

Abelia 'Wevo01'

Introduced by Concept Plants. Developed by Lendert de Vos from The Netherlands. Zones 6-9.

A vigorous grower for this type of variegated plant, Lucky Lots is very well branched. The foliage is bright, and the variegation is stable. White, scented flowers bloom from June through October. Bushy habit reaches 40 inches tall and 20 inches wide. Ideal in mixed planters. borders or as a specimen choice. Prefers full sun to partial shade. Low maintenance.

Old Fashioned Smoke Bush

Cotinus coggygria 'Old Fashioned' USPP #19035

Introduced by UpShoot LLC. Bred by Henny Kolster from Boskoop, The Netherlands. Zone 5.

This new smoke bush is smaller in stature and noted for its distinctive, deer-resistant foliage. Leaves and shoots emerge purple and mature to a blue-green similar to *Eucalyptus*. In fall the foliage becomes a blaze of fluorescent red, pink and orange hues. Fast growing, with a broad upright shape to 6 feet tall and 5 feet wide. Best grown as a garden specimen shrub. Can be trained into a small tree and also utilized for cut flowers. Plant in full sun and provide well-drained, slightly dry, gravelly soil.

Buxus sempervirens 'Skywalker'

Introduced by Concept Plants. Developed by Mark Ellerbrook in Oregon. Zones 5-9.

Skywalker is an excellent new selection that will grow up to 30 inches in a season. Foliage is typical of common boxwood and maintains its green color well through the winter. Fast-growing, columnar habit to 15 feet tall and 3 feet wide. Ideal as a landscape shrub, tall hedge or used as a topiary specimen. Excellent for pyramids, spirals, cones, blocks and forms. Prefers full sun. Root disease resistant.

Marianni Daphne

Daphne odora 'Rogbret' USPP #21820

Introduced as a hybridized selection in Europe by Sapho in France. Represented in North America by Ball Ornamentals. Zones 6-8.

Broadleaf evergreen foliage is widely edged in light yellow variegation and is more intense than the traditional 'Aureomarginata' variety. Marianni has a superior branching habit and structure, and grows faster in a container and in the landscape than other *odora* varieties. Grows 2–3 feet tall and 3 feet wide. Does well with moderate moisture conditions and performs well in acidic soils.

Happiness Euonymus

Euonymus japonica 'Happiness'

Introduced by Concept Plants. Developed by Johan Nouws from The Netherlands. Zones 6b-9.

A new Euonymus variety, particularly distinguished by its compact, upright habit and bright golden foliage. 'Happiness' is evergreen, with shoots that emerge light yellow-green and fade to deep yellow. Reaches 2 feet tall and 1 foot wide. Ideal in the landscape as a low hedge, shrub border, specimen choice or in mixed containers.

Each leaf of this shrub or small tree possesses an exquisite melding of yellow, lime and green, providing an illuminating effect in a dappled shade setting. Prized for its unique, highly textural foliage. with central tricolor variegation, it often blooms fall to winter, producing showy panicles of white flower clusters. A moderate grower reaching 5-8 feet tall and 5 feet wide, it's a standout as a shaded foundation or entry plant, tree



understory accent or container specimen. Prefers dappled shade or full shade in hot inland areas and humusrich, evenly moist, well-drained soil. Can tolerate some frost. Evergreen.

Hibiscus syriacus 'Aarticus' PPAF

Aptly named, this variegated hibiscus has blue-green foliage with creamy white margins. Dark pink to lavender single flowers add to the show in the summer. Great feature plant for smaller gardens or in patio containers. Grows 3-4 feet tall and wide. Plant in full sun for best flowering effect and foliage color.



If you're looking for intensity, Let's Dance® Rave™ Hydrangea will deliver with blooms saturated in unique shades of rich purple or hot pink. One of the strongest re-blooming hydrangeas on the market. Compact habit reaches 2-3 feet tall and wide. Use in landscapes in mass plantings, as a border plant, or as a specimen or focal point. Great for cut flowers; can be grown as a container plant in mild climates. Prefers part sun and moist, well-drained soils.

Baby Lace® wows with petite, lacy white blooms in summer against dark green foliage. Strong stems boast full, white inflorescences and sepals that turn pink with maturity in cool climates. Great for container gardening and makes excellent fresh-cut flower arrangements that dry beautifully. Dwarf, compact habit to 3½ feet tall and wide after five years. Ideal for borders, accents or mass plantings. Makes an excellent choice for container gardens or specimen plantings. Prefers full sun to partial shade, and moist, well-drained soil. Disease resistant.

Little Ragu™ Sweet Bay

Laurus nobilis 'MonRik' PPAF

Introduced by Monrovia. Discovered as a sport of *Laurus nobilis* 'Monem' by a Monrovia craftsman in Dayton, Oregon. Zones 8-11.

A shorter, more compact selection, this bay's deep green, wavy leaves emerge on red-tinged stems, providing yearround interest and a fabulous fragrance. A slow-to-moderate grower, Little Ragu™ reaches 6-8 feet tall and wide in about 10 years, making it ideal as a specimen shrub or small tree, clipped hedge or topiary. It's also a natural for large containers or in herb gardens (dried leaves are useful as a culinary seasoning). Prefers full sun to part shade and enriched, well-drained soils; highly adaptable



to most soil types. Once established, it needs only occasional water. Evergreen.

Jazz Hands® Bold Fringeflower

Loropetalum chinense 'Kurenai Daiou' PPAF

Introduced by Proven Winners* Color Choice*.

Bred in Japan by Yuji Suzuki. Zones 7b-9b.

Supersized flowers and foliage are the unique features to this varietal. Jazz Hands® is an eye-catching shrub with extralarge, round purple leaves that flush pink to contrast with the hot pink bloom. The flowers are larger than those of any other Loropetalum. Reaches 5-6 feet tall and wide. Use in landscapes in mass plantings, as a border plant, or as a specimen or focal point. Does well in containers. Prefers full or part sun and fertile, well-drained, acidic



soils. For best results prune after flowering.

Lagerstroemia 'PIILAG-VII' PPAF

Supremely adapted to the West's arid summers, vine maples have great fall color but are typically rank growers and often poorly pruned by maintenance personnel. September Sun has the darkest green, glossy leaves of any alder native to North America, and its stunning fall colors set it apart from others. Autumn brings a display of yellow, orange and rich brown leaves. In late summer blooms of gold-



en, pendulous catkins appear and contrast beautifully against the foliage. The woody, cone-like fruits are produced each year and persist on the plant through winter. Often grown as a multi-stemmed large shrub, it will reach 18 feet tall and 15 feet wide at maturity. Excellent for use in the landscape as a hedge, a specimen or for wildlife habitat in wetland areas. Easily trained by trimming or pruning. Prefers full sun and moist conditions, but is more drought resistant than other alders.

Farges Filbert

Corylus fargesii

Introduced by Heritage Seedlings & Liners. Farges Filbert is from Central China. In 1996 and 2005 plant explorers with North American-China Plant Exploration Consortium (NACPEC) returned wild-collected seed of this species. Zones 5–9.

Widely admired for exfoliating bark reminiscent of a river birch or even paperbark maple, this species is widely adapted and hardy. Farges Filbert is not bothered by pests. Clean green leaves emerge with a pink blush, turning yellow in autumn. Strongly upright with a good central leader, in 20 years it reaches 25-30 feet tall and 18 feet wide. Best grown as a specimen tree or shade tree; superior form makes it a high-quality street tree with aboveaverage interest. It prefers full sun and average soil, but will grow in



poor soils. May have some resistance to Filbert Blight. Available as #1 containers from Heritage Seedlings & Liners (Booth #9037).

Claim Jumper™ Golden Katsura

Cercidiphyllum japonicum 'Claim Jumper'

Introduced by Heritage Seedlings & Liners. Found by Eric Hammond as a seedling at Heritage Seedlings & Liners. Zones 5-8.

Totally new and unusual, this katsura has soft. golden leaves from spring to frost. Leaves emerge with a pink blush and unfurl to soft yellow. The pink new growth of Claim Jumper™ stands out well against older leaves as a beautiful contrast. In summer the more shaded leaves turn green, while those in the sun remain yellow. Autumn brings the characteristic sweet fragrance and buttery golden color to the foliage. Grows upwards of 20 feet tall and 15 feet wide. Best

A superior, tight form that stays columnar and flame-shaped over the years. Clean, insect- and diseaseresistant green leaves turn bright golden yellow and red-orange in autumn. Over time the bark handsomely exfoliates. Golden Belltower is a moderate grower and will reach 30 feet tall and 10 feet wide in 20 vears. Makes an excellent choice for smaller yards and tight spots, and is a logical choice for commercial plantings or as a street tree.



The best fall color will be achieved by growing it in full sun, however it will grow equally well in part shade. Drought resistant once established.

Prunus 'NCPH1'

A co-introduction by J. Frank Schmidt & Son Co. and North Carolina State University. Developed and tested at NCSU from the breeding and selection program of Dr. Tom Ranney. Zone 5.

Bright pink flowers smother the graceful, weeping branches of this petite ornamental cherry that resembles the popular, white-blooming Snow Fountains® Cherry in summer appearance. Dark green foliage turns orange in autumn. Reaches approximately 12 feet tall and wide at maturity. Outstanding when planted as solitary landscape specimens, in groves or incorporated into water features. Plant in large containers, atop retaining walls or in rock gardens to give the long, graceful weeping branches the opportunity



to cascade. Plant in full to part sun, average soil and water needs. Good heat resistance is proven by its North Carolina origin; trials in western Oregon show it to have good resistance to typical cherry foliage diseases.

Urban Pinnacle™ Oak

Quercus macrocarpa 'JFS-KW3' USPP #22815

Introduced by J. Frank Schmidt & Son Co. Discovered by Keith Warren as a chance seedling in the production fields of J. Frank Schmidt & Son Co. Zone 3.

Leaf shape is large and deeply lobed in the shape that is typical of bur oak. Its attractive, dark green, unusual glossy foliage is resistant to both mildew and anthracnose. Handsome vellow fall color adds seasonal appeal. Petite acorns of about ½-inch diameter are extremely small in comparison to typical bur oak acorns, making the tree a better choice than the species for use near paved areas, courtyards and sidewalks. Predictable, unusually narrow and upright



form reaches approximately 55 feet tall and 25 feet wide at maturity, recommending it as an excellent shade tree for boulevards, parks and commercial landscape settings and on larger residential properties. Plant in full sun. Heat and drought tolerant.

Dense, evergreen foliage is resistant to black spot, oidium and greenfly. Bluish fruits appear in the fall; very winter hardy. Vine-like habit reaches 8 feet tall and 7 feet wide. Ideal as a trellised vine, on wall or fence plantings, as a ground cover, or grown in the perennial border. Nice choice for mixed containers.
